

Forestry England is part of the Forestry Commission.


We manage England's beautiful, diverse, productive, and publicly owned woods and forests.


About this role

Working in the unique landscape of the New Forest, you'll you will be directly involved in the delivery of the New Forest HLS scheme.

Launched in 2010, and led by Forestry England, the HLS scheme is one of the most ambitious habitat restoration projects in the country, having delivered over £22 million of investment to-date.

Covering 20,000 hectares of open heathland, that is unequalled in Europe, the scheme will improve habitats for rare wildlife, protect streams and mires from further erosion, help to manage flood risk, and increase resilience to drought.


Successful delivery will involve working in a diverse and professional team that will include foresters, ecologists, recreation managers, civil engineers, and communications and finance colleagues.





Key work areas for this role

- Support our Restoration Officers in planning work programmes and setting up and managing operational contracts to deliver habitat restoration across the New Forest
- Supervise work programmes such as wetland restoration, bed level raising, drain infill, restoration repairs, harvesting, tree felling, and rhododendron clearance
- Maintain high standards of delivery through the supervision of staff and contractors
- Monitor the health and safety practices of contractors and Forestry England staff to ensure high standards of safety
- Build and maintain excellent professional relationships and communications with Forestry England staff, contractors, stakeholders and members of the public
- Undertake regular travel to locations that are inaccessible by public transport





Essential experience

- Relevant experience in countryside management and conservation, especially wetland restoration and/or forestry
- Supervising operational contracts and resources
- Good understanding of, and experience in, the application of health and safety in a land management and/or forestry context
- Working in a team environment that includes close collaboration with colleagues from other departments
